Support for Offshore wind SMEs targeting South Korea

JCI Project: ELBE Eurocluster

FOR WHOM?

European SMEs interested in promoting their offshore wind related solutions and/or products in South Korea.

To apply for the support, it is required to:

- Be a SME according to the European definition: the formal definition is available here: https://ec.europa.eu/growth/smes/business-friendly-environment/sme-definition en
- Develop a product or service positioned on the offshore wind value chain: project development & siting, assembly & installation, foundations, design and manufacturing of converters (wind turbines, wave and tidal converters), grid connection, operation & maintenance and/or support services & auxiliary equipment
- Be located in one of the following eligible countries: EU-27, Liechtenstein, Iceland and Norway.

WHY GET THE SUPPORT FOR OFFSHORE WIND SMES TARGETING SOUTH KOREA?

South Korea plans to realize 12 GW of offshore wind projects by 2030, including floating wind. European expertise will be necessary to achieve this goal.

WHAT DOES THE SUPPORT INCLUDE?

The ELBE Alliance will select 15 SMEs to receive financial support of 2000 €. This support will enable the SME to start and deploy its market strategy towards South Korea.

The support received from the ELBE Eurocluster should be dedicated to actions looking for a market development in South Korea.

Successful applicants may use the financial support received to join the ELBE Alliance mission to South Korea that will be held from November 26th to 30th in Seoul and Ulsan/Busan.

The ELBE Alliance offshore wind mission to South Korea will include:

• Meeting with KOTRA (Korea Trade- Investment Promotion Agency) and KWEA (Korea Wind Energy Association) explaining the offshore wind potential South Korea;



- The Korean offshore wind permitting process;
- Presentation of Floating Wind Projects in Ulsan;
- Presentation of Smart Mooring solutions promoting co-existence between floating offshore wind and fisheries/ aquaculture;
- Technical Seminar;
- Presentation by Busan Port Authorities (BPA) and Busan 2030 World expo;
- Visit to a Shipyard;
- Visit to a production yard (industrialisation opportunities for producing floaters and optimal use of the Korean supply chain).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROVIDED

If you are an SME, you will receive a support of 2000 € to finance part of your South Korea international development in the form of a lump sum.

SELECTION

A limited number of SMEs can benefit from the financial support. Eligible applicants (cf. eligibility conditions) will be selected upon the following selection criteria:

- Maturity of the solution to be exported;
- Knowledge and identification of the markets and stakeholders to be approached;
- First steps that have been already deployed to reach the South Korean market.

Each criterion will be scored up to 5. The total score is comprised by adding the scores of the three criteria and will be of maximum 15 points.

Each sub-criterion is rated between 1 and 5 points. No half points are allowed (decimal points may arise during normalisation, but not as an individual evaluation grade).

In case of proposals with equal scores, the prevailing one would be the one that have already conducted preliminary steps to understand, know and reach the South Korean market.

The meaning of the scores for the sub-criteria are as follows:

- 1 Poor: the sub-criterion is addressed in an inadequate manner, or there are serious inherent weaknesses:
- 2 Fair: while the proposal broadly addresses the sub-criterion, there are significant weaknesses;
- 3 Good: the proposal addresses the sub-criterion well, but with at least one moderate weakness;
- 4 Very good: the proposal addresses the sub-criterion very well, although with minor weaknesses;
- **5 Excellent**: the proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the sub criterion in question. Any shortcomings are minor.

Submitted applications will be assessed by the representatives of the ELBE Eurocluster partners (2 ELBE reviewers per application). The assessment period shall take max. 40 days, starting from the closing date of the call and will be complete with the development of a ranking list. The applicants will receive an email about the outcome of the assessment directly after the assessment is finalised along with



instructions for the next steps in the case the applicant is awarded. The successful applicants will be requested to sign a formal Contract with ELBE partners within 30 days from the notification of the application approval.

For any complaints against the internationalisation services selection process, these have to be submitted by the applicant on behalf of the project to msuarez@clusterenergia.com or your local contact point (Cf. Below the list of contact points) within 5 calendar days after the announcement of the Open Call results. Your email should include the following information:

- Lead contact name and details;
- Object of your complaint;
- Information and evidence of the alleged breach.

The ELBE Eurocluster partners will examine the complaint based on the information brought forward by the applicant, will assess the case, and decide whether the complaint is justified or not and will inform the applicant and the consortium on the decision taken. If the complaint is considered justified, ELBE Eurocluster partners will re-evaluate the project application and the related assessment part, subject to the complaint. The final decision on the complaint will be communicated to the applicant in writing within 20 working days from the date of submitting the complaint. This decision will be final, binding to all parties and not subject to any further complaint proceedings within the programme if the complaint is based on the same grounds.

REPORTING

No justification of costs is expected for the use of the lump sum. However, SMEs are expected to answer a very short impact assessment report after the mission (number of meetings, type of collaboration). The data collected as part of this short survey will only be used for the purposes of ELBE Eurocluster project.
