Support for Offshore Renewable Energy SMEs to enter markets in United Kingdom, United States of America, Brazil or Japan

JCI Project: ELBE Eurocluster

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS (FOR WHOM?)

SMEs interested in promoting their offshore renewable energy related solutions and/or products in the United Kingdom (UK), the United States of America (USA), Brazil or Japan.

To apply for the support, it is required to:

- Be a SME according to the European definition: the formal definition is available here: https://ec.europa.eu/growth/smes/business-friendly-environment/sme-definition_en;
- Develop a product or service positioned on the offshore renewable energy value chain: project development & siting, assembly & installation, foundations, design and manufacturing of converters (e.g. wind turbines, wave and tidal converters), grid connection, operation & maintenance and/or support services & auxiliary equipment;
- Be located in one of the following eligible countries: EU-27 or an non-EU country participating in the Single Market Programme/COSME Strand (see the list of countries [here](#)).

WHY GET THE SUPPORT FOR OFFSHORE WIND SMEs TARGETING UNITED KINGDOM, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, BRAZIL OR JAPAN?

The **United Kingdom** has 14GW offshore renewable energy capacity installed, and the ambition is to deploy up to 50GW by 2030, with up to 5GW coming from floating offshore wind. The project pipeline of around 77GW across 80 projects offer significant opportunities around the whole offshore value chain.

The **United States** offshore renewable energy pipeline mounts up to 53GW. Despite a tumultuous 2023, offshore wind installation works are ongoing at the East coast with two offshore wind farms reaching completion. Recently, new lease areas have been opened in the Gulf of Mexico. The US targets to deploy 15GW of floating offshore wind by 2035.

Offshore wind development in **Brazil** is in its early stages, with an estimated potential of over 700GW due to favorable wind conditions. Currently, around 183GW of projects have applied for environmental

investigation licences, reflecting significant interest and investment. The government is developing regulatory frameworks and incentives to attract stakeholders. There is a strong interest to link production of green hydrogen to offshore wind development.

Japan currently has six operational offshore wind farms, with two of them being large-scale, the 84 MW Noshiro Port and the 54.6 MW Akita Port projects. The Japanese government aims to deploy 10GW of offshore wind capacity by 2030 and 30-45GW by 2040, including floating wind, as part of its target to reach net-zero emissions by 2050.

WHAT DOES THE SUPPORT INCLUDE?

The support received from the ELBE Eurocluster should be dedicated to actions looking for a market development in the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Brazil or Japan such as, flights and accommodations for a business visit in the target country, cost for support of a service provider of the SME's choice to establish contacts in the target country, or participation to a dedicated event in the target country. These are some examples, other activities related to onsite market development are also included in this support.

The internationalisation activities funded by this support have to be finalised by **June 30th 2025**.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROVIDED

If you are an SME, you will receive the support for your international development in the form of a lump sum.

This amount is:

- 1.500 € for the UK
- 2.500 € for the USA
- 2.000 € for Brazil
- 2.500 € for Japan

SMEs may apply for support for more than one country. If so, they should submit one application per country.

The total support available for this call for proposals for all four countries amounts to 53.000 € and is divided as stated below:

- 15.000 € for the UK
- 17.500 € for the USA
- 8.000 € for Brazil
- 12.500 € for Japan

If there are not enough successful applicants for one of the countries, ELBE Eurocluster reserves the right to shift the unused budget to other destinations.

The budget may be increased in case that additional funds are available from other calls. ELBE Eurocluster reserves the right not to award all available funds depending on the proposals received and the results of the evaluation.

In case there are eligible applications, 10% of the total ELBE Eurocluster budget is reserved to SMEs coming from EU countries that are not represented in the ELBE Eurocluster consortium. SMEs from those countries that will reach a score above the thresholds mentioned in the following section (Selection), will receive priority on funding until exceeding that 10%.

The internationalisation support will be paid out in 2 payment instalments of 50% each. The first instalment will be paid after the signature of the subgrant agreement between the beneficiary and the ELBE partner. The second instalment will be paid after the realisation of the service.

SELECTION

A limited number of SMEs can benefit from the financial support. Eligible applicants (cf. eligibility conditions) will be evaluated upon the following selection criteria:

- Criterion 1: Maturity of the solution to be exported;
- Criterion 2: Knowledge and identification of the markets and stakeholders to be approached;
- Criterion 3: Quality of the planned internationalization activities.

Each criterion will be scored up to 5. No half points are allowed. The total score is comprised by adding the scores of the three criteria and will be of maximum 15 points. The minimum total threshold is 7 points, SMEs below that score will not be funded.

In case of proposals reach equal scores, the prevailing one would be the one with a higher score under criterion 2. If two proposals have equal scores and the same score under criterion 2, the prevailing one would be the one with a higher score under criteria 3.

The meaning of the scores for the sub-criteria are as follows:

1 – Poor: the sub-criterion is addressed in an inadequate manner, or there are serious inherent weaknesses;

2 – Fair: while the proposal broadly addresses the sub-criterion, there are significant weaknesses;

3 – Good: the proposal addresses the sub-criterion well, but with at least one moderate weakness;

4 – Very good: the proposal addresses the sub-criterion very well, although with minor weaknesses;

5 – Excellent: the proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the sub criterion in question. Any shortcomings are minor.

A two-step assessment procedure will be followed safeguarding the principles of transparency and equal treatment as described below:

- Eligibility check of the Application Form;
- Evaluation of the Application Form by the ELBE partners.

Submitted applications will be assessed by the representatives of the ELBE Eurocluster partners (2 ELBE reviewers per application). The final score of the application will be determined as average of the scores attributed by the different assessors. Thus, the final score might be containing decimal points. The assessment period shall take maximum 21 days, starting from the closing date of the call. The applicants will receive an e-mail about the outcome of the assessment directly after the assessment is finalised

along with instructions for the next steps if their proposal has been awarded. The successful applicants will be requested to sign a formal Contract within 30 days from the notification of the project approval.

For any complaints against the internationalisation services selection process, these have to be submitted by the applicant to your local contact point (Cf. below the list of contact points) within 5 calendar days after the announcement of the Open Call results. Your email should include the following information:

- Lead contact name and details;
- Object of your complaint;
- Information and evidence of the alleged breach.

The ELBE Eurocluster partner in charge (i.e. the local contact point) will examine the complaint based on the information brought forward by the applicant, will assess the case, and decide whether the complaint is justified or not and will inform the applicant and the other ELBE Eurocluster partners on the decision taken. If the complaint is considered justified, ELBE Eurocluster partners will re-evaluate the project application and the related assessment part, subject to the complaint. The final decision on the complaint will be communicated to the applicant in writing within 20 working days from the date of submitting the complaint. This decision will be final, binding to all parties and not subject to any further complaint proceedings within the programme if the complaint is based on the same grounds.

REPORTING

No justification of costs is expected for the use of the lump sum. However, SMEs are expected to answer an **impact assessment report** after the internationalisation service (description of the progress of the service, number of meetings, type of collaboration, business agreements, etc.). The data collected as part of this survey will only be used for the purposes of ELBE Eurocluster project. The final payment of 50% will be executed after submission and approval of the impact assessment report.
